#### At any moment, we can be meeting Jesus if we're alert.

Jesus says in the Gospel of Mark that, No one knows about that day or hour, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father.

Since we do not know the day or the hour, we are to live in a state of constant watchfulness. Jesus uses a parable of a man who travels abroad and who gives his servants authority and entrusts them with his own work. He orders the gatekeeper to be on the watch for his return. This parable refers to Jesus and the Church. Jesus is the man who leaves home for a time, and will return as Lord over the house of God. The servants and the gatekeeper are members of the Church. "Jesus has already delegated authority to his apostles (Mark 6:7; 10:42-44); now he speaks of his departure, when they will exercise his authority over the community he has founded. Each has been entrusted with his work, a unique service or ministry to carry out within the household of faith.

The gatekeeper, referring to Peter who has greatest responsibility for vigilance (Luke 12:41-42), has an especially important duty: to perceive the master's return in time to prepare a suitable welcome" (The Gospel of Mark).

Jesus speaks about his coming passion and encourages his disciples and all of us to be watchful. This means for us that "the trial of Gethsemane is the beginning of the trial that will last throughout the whole age of the Church, in which Jesus' followers are called to be constantly alert and attentive to the presence of their Lord" (M. Healy, The Gospel of Mark, 273).
