FIRST MISSION

If I were to ask you who Jesus is, you'd say he's the Son of God, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, fully human and fully divine, the Messiah who saves us from the power of Satan, the

Redeemer whose death was the price of our freedom. He rose from the dead, ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father, from whence he will come to judge the living and the dead.

But until Holy Week 2,000 years ago no one knew hardly any of this. Until then, people knew Jesus only as a preacher, exorcist and healer, so when he sent his disciples out on their first mission, it was to do what he had been doing: to preach, drive out demons and heal the sick.

You and I are disciples of Jesus every bit as much as they were and we know far more about him than they did prior to that first Holy Week. Since we have been given more and understand more, we will be held to a higher standard.

What God expects of us today is essentially the same as it has always been: That we preach conversion, that we proclaim the truth with courage, that we banish evil with prayer, that we cure the sick with healing love — the things that only God can do, but as we see in the Scriptures, God can and wants to do them through us.

And to do so, we will sometimes find ourselves dealing with people who are against the gospel values. But that's what spending the rest of our lives doing what Jesus had done requires, and in so doing we too will become ever more intimately united to Jesus, our Savior, already in this life and most fully in the life to come.

Basically, what seems foolish in the eyes of most of our friends, family, and coworkers who don't have a relationship with God is often the thing that is most important to us. What seems silly to the world is the very thing that ushers in the power of God. The kingdom of God operates in a way that is the exact opposite of everything that seems natural to living in this world today.

Living in the freedom of the paradoxes of the gospel feels unnatural, abnormal, and, frankly, absolutely crazy. Maybe that is why it takes so much faith. God Bless.

Following the June 10, 2021 announcement regarding the delegation of Indigenous people to meet with the Holy Father to foster meaningful encounters of dialogue and healing, the Catholic Bishops of Canada are pleased to announce that the delegation is scheduled to take place from December 17-20, 2021 in compliance with global travel restrictions.

Pope Francis is deeply committed to hearing directly from Indigenous Peoples, expressing his heartfelt closeness, addressing the impact of colonization and the role of the Church in the residential school system, in the hopes of responding to the suffering of Indigenous Peoples and the ongoing effects of intergenerational trauma. The Bishops of Canada are deeply appreciative of the Holy Father's spirit of openness in generously extending an invitation for personal encounters with each of the three distinct groups of delegates - First Nations, Métis and Inuit – as well as a final audience with all delegates together on December 20, 2021.
