

REFLECTION

Frederick Beuchner once remarked, "Envy is the consuming desire to have everybody else as unsuccessful as you are." We humans are often afraid that we are not all that we should be. We constantly compare ourselves to others and often come up short in our own eyes. Unfortunately we often try to make ourselves feel better about ourselves by putting others down. Today's scripture readings offer us food for thought on the subject of envy. Unlike most of us, the wicked in the

passage from Wisdom are honest with themselves about their motives for attacking the just-envy. James sees envy as the root of much of the evil and disorder caused by humans and suffered by humans. Envy causes dissension in and among individuals, groups, and nations. It leads us to forget gratitude for the many blessings we do have. Jesus is teaching his disciples a reversal of the values which are the result of envy. They will not understand until they witness his death, resurrection and the coming of the Spirit. By putting his arms around a child Jesus makes a strong point. Children were not coddled and sentimentalized in the ancient world. They had no rights. They represent the innocent, the ones open to hear God's word, the ones without ambition, undefended against exploitation.

Pope Francis in *Laudato Si,* continually reminds us of the terrible effects that consumerism has wrought on our psyches, our ability to be content with what we have, on the lives of innocent creatures, and on the environment.

"If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." Mark 9:35 Jesus teaches us that we are called to serve one another. Sacrifice is not a word that many people like to hear. We think it means that we must give up something that we want. However, the literal meaning of sacrifice is "to make holy," we make our lives holy by sharing our gifts in the service of God.


