# **REFLECTION:**



The theme that runs through the readings for this weekend is that, despite

difficulties, we are invited by our faith to work for the "justification" of those around us. Our high priest is able to sympathize with us because he too faced tests in his ministry. Yet he remained faithful to his mission to the end, that of proclaiming and establishing the Kingdom of God in our midst. The attitude that we are called to imitate is that of a servant, someone who is willing to serve and not be concerned with position or power.

In Laudato Si' Pope Francis repeatedly invites us and all people to the process of dialogue in order to address the problems that we face in our world today, especially those of ecological destruction and increasing poverty. The Pope is concerned with the well-being of all God's creatures, and he calls for a spirit of solidarity and generosity to work for the common good. No individual and no nation should be concerned only about their individual well-being. Rather, all are convoked to work together for the good of all. The gravity of our situation demands such a response from everyone.

Good stewards must not argue about who is the most important. Today's Gospel says clearly that those who aspire to greatness must humbly serve the needs of all. Even Jesus came not to be served, but to serve.
