### **REFLECTION:**



Our readings today highlight the plight of the people of God. In the first reading and the responsorial psalm the people find themselves in exile, far from their land and yearning for a return to their previous life. They cry out to the Lord who hears them and promises comfort. A desert people are promised torrents of water to ease their suffering.

In the Gospel the beggar Bartimaeus is living in the darkness of his blindness. In a moment of desperation and inspiration, he cries out to Jesus who is passing by, undeterred by those in the crowd who call on him to be silent. Jesus restores his sight and tells him that he has been saved by his faith.

The message of Pope Francis in *Laudato Si'* is also a cry to the Lord. He is distressed by the destruction of the earth and the condition of the poor, but he is convinced that the generosity and solidarity of people can and will win out. The growing awareness that the earth is our common homeland, and the concern of many for the common good should inspire all to live in harmony, to make sacrifices for our sisters and brothers, and to rebuild together the home which God has given us. Our faith, and the faith of so many other believers throughout the world, should be a catalyst to help us confront our problems and resolve them for the benefit of all.
