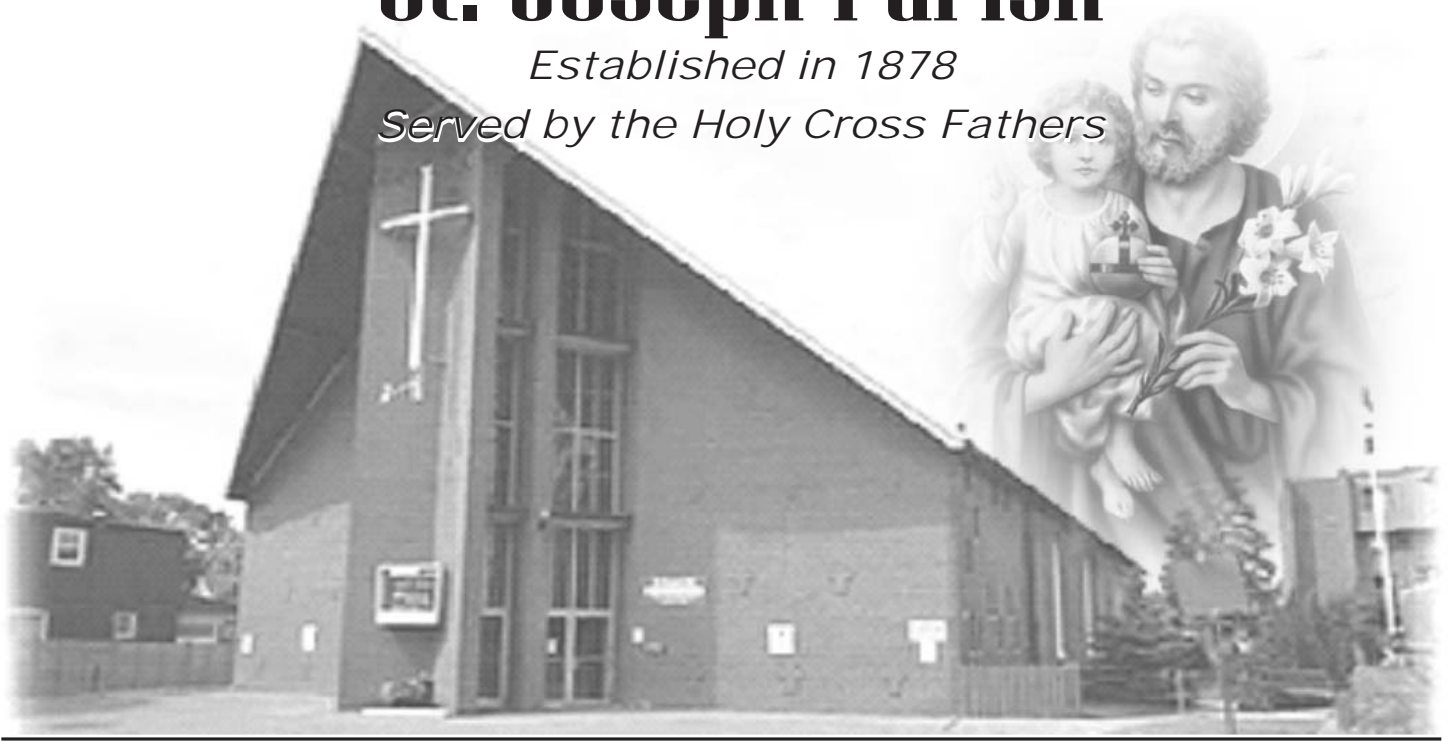

POSITIVE THINKING IS HOLY THINKING

When you give in to thinking that's ripping you to shreds, that deflates your confidence, that caves in to all your fear... you're not just thinking negatively. You're thinking in a way that's unholy.

God wants his people to face everyday life not just redeemed from sin, but with redeemed attitudes. Redeemed thinking. A redeemed sense of who they are. We are exhausting ourselves by allowing our thoughts to get the best of us.

Saint Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 10:5, "...and every pretension raising itself against the knowledge of God, and take every thought captive in obedience to Christ..." You should think like someone who believes in a God who created you with purpose, who gives meaning to every experience, who bestowed dignity and royalty upon you, and who destined you for eternal glory! And why should you think that way? Because it's all true.

So, when the way you think builds you up instead of ripping you down, that's not just "positive thinking." That's holy thinking.

Just follow these simple tips to reach a positive attitude and to keep it. **1. Pray** : By praying, you are allowing God to intervene and help you calm down. Even if it is something minor like stress from driving in traffic, praying for peace should be part of everyone's daily routine.

2. Be thankful: Nothing creates a more positive attitude than being thankful. Humans take everything for granted the trick is recognizing how very blessed you really are. You may think simple expressions of gratitude are standard, but a surprising number of people fail to thank people. It's very easy to do, all you need is two simple words: "Thank you."

3. Stop holding grudges: Easier said than done, right? The bottom line is when you hold a grudge, you literally hold negativity in your heart. When you refuse to let go of negative experiences and emotions, it is impossible to maintain a healthy, positive attitude. Evaluate grudges logically, rather than emotionally, and suddenly forgiveness won't seem so inconceivable.

National Rosary for the Family: June 19, 2022

From: Patrick Douglas, Associate Director, Family Life and Special Projects In preparation for the 10th World Meeting of Families (WMF), the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops' Standing Committee for Family and Life is hosting a live and nationwide Rosary for the Family via Zoom Webinar. The virtual event will take place on Sunday, June 19 at 3 p.m. and will be facilitated by several families from across the country. As part of the Amoris Laetitia Family Year, the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network and the Dicastery for the Laity, Family and Life have published a "Rosary for the Family." The publication is a beautiful meditation focused on families, children, couples and grandparents. It is the hope of the Standing Committee for Family and Life that this moment will be an opportunity to gather at the national level in prayer as well as to witness alongside other faith-filled families. You are invited to share and promote this initiative in your parishes, especially to reach out to families.

Sunday Mass Obligation: Given that most of the health and safety restrictions in our parishes are no longer in place and the faithful are able to attend the celebration of the Eucharist once again, the basis for the dispensation from the Sunday obligation has dissipated and is no longer in effect. The Church does not obligate people to do the impossible. If individuals, based on their conscience, cannot attend Mass for a grave reason, including a great vulnerability to COVID-19 or because they are self-isolating to limit the spread of illness, then they are excused from their Sunday obligation, as the law of the Church allows. If you are well, the pastors encourages the faithful to return to the practice of attending Mass in-person.

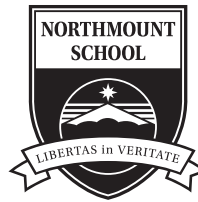
