The Season of fall to New Life

I know many people like to think of spring as the season of beginnings, but in my mind, it was always autumn. Maybe it was because in the autumn the leaves began to turn all sorts of brilliant colors and fall from the trees, signaling that a change was in the air. The season of autumn is a bittersweet reminder that death is the beginning of birth; that sorrow gives way to serenity, and that for the believer, the grave yields ultimately to new life.

Fall calls us to release the past and let it drift away like a fallen leaf on the wind. It points to the cold and darker days of winter that lay ahead and of our own spiritual deaths that we contemplate beside a cozy fire in a warm home. In some mysterious way, it means safety, even though it means change.

Jesus said, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit" (John 12:24). As we look back on the autumns of our life, we see that each small death we experienced was really a part of the ongoing mystery of growing in our relationship with our Savior. Each encounter with Christ was a surrender to the childish ways to which we clung so closely but from which we were constantly moving away.

In these trials, Christ was helping us to face the deeper deaths to self that took place in the intimacy of His entering more deeply into our life. With every submission, more of our selfish nature was yielding to the greater knowledge of what it meant to live as a pilgrim on this earth. It taught us to surrender to God's will and remove ourselves from the throne as we connected in greater ways to what living as a child of God was all about. The many deaths we experience over the course of our days on this earth enable us to bear the sorrow and the loss of growing away from this life toward heaven. They allow grace to open our hearts to the peace that passes understanding as we yield to the Spirit's work in our hearts.

Change is never easy. The endings that changes bring can tear at the deepest parts of who we are. They often leave us overwhelmed by the pressures of life around us, sometimes causing us to linger in the dark of confusion, brokenness, and isolation. In those sacred moments when we surrender to God, the tomb becomes the womb as we experience our ongoing transformation. God Bless. *Fr. Roshan Loy D'Souza, CSC*

Catholicism 101: Liturgical Calendar Year.

The liturgical year is made up of six seasons: **Advent** - four weeks of preparation before the celebration of Jesus' birth. Reflecting on: HOPE, LOVE, JOY & PEACE **Christmas** - recalling the Nativity of Jesus Christ and his manifestation to the peoples of the world. **Lent** - a six-week period of penance before Easter. **Sacred Paschal**

Triduum - the holiest "Three Days" of the Church's year, where Christians recall the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus.
Easter - 50 days of joyful celebration of the Lord's resurrection from the dead and his sending forth of the Holy Spirit.
Ordinary Time - divided into two sections (one span of 4-8 weeks after Christmas Time and another lasting about six months after Easter Time), wherein the faithful consider the

fullness of Jesus' teachings and works among his people.
