From the Pastor's Desk

A Celebration of Waiting.

Today, in the era of instant-everything,

I wonder if we forget that Advent is a celebration of waiting fulfilled. Christmas itself is the vindication of Old Testament believers who spent long, uncomfortable lives clinging to wispy words of prophecy and trusting God's good intentions toward them. It's the season of Mary's "yes" to a nine -month obedience, a season of open-ended journeys prompted by visions and unexpected stars.

We also live in a world of waiting, and the only difference is that now we have the Hallmark Channel, our social media feed, and our frantic pace to distract us from our true situation, which can be described as "the interim time."

We live between two mighty events—that of [Jesus's] incarnation, death, and resurrection, and that of His ultimate appearing and the glorification of those He died to save. This is the interim time for the saints—but it is not a vacuum. He has given us much to do and He asks for our faithfulness."

We have a choice as we wait. We can fret and forget our purpose, or we can let his joy wash over us like a baptism in slow motion. It's not easy to wait, especially in our need. But Advent plunges us into the waiting, reminds us that there's something at the end to make it all worthwhile. We are waiting for joy and blessing so great that if we would only fix our eyes on it, like Jesus we'd be able to endure even our daily crosses.

God Works While We Wait. Waiting Here For You helps us anticipate rather than dread the busy season of Advent and Christmas. A season overflowing with anticipation, Christmas comes the same time each year with great hope and promise of a baby born long ago. But, this season meant for joy is often consumed by busyness, pressure, mixed emotions, and is gone as quickly as it came. What is it all for? In the journey of Advent a season of expectant waiting and preparation - we find our answer. It's in the waiting season of Advent that we prepare our hearts to meet December 25 with joy, peace, hope, and promise in our newborn King.

Catholicism 101: The Story Of The Advent Wreath.

In the days before Christianity in Scandinavia, people placed lit candles on a wheel; prayers were offered to their god of light, in the hope that the earth's wheel would be turned back toward the sun, bringing light and warmth. Like many beloved Advent traditions, the modern-day tradition of the Advent wreath originates in Germany. The story goes that in 1839, Johann Hinrich Wichern (1808-81), a pastor in Germany, built a wreath out of an old cartwheel to help the children in his mission school count the days until Christmas. He added small candles to be lit every weekday and Saturday during Advent, and on Sundays, a large white candle was lit. Although it wasn't widely popular until the 19th century, German immigrants then brought the tradition with them to America in the 20th century. The evergreens used in today's wreaths represent everlasting life; holly leaves and berries represent the crown of thorns and blood; and pine cones symbolize the resurrection.


