From the Pastor's Desk:

There is a joke about making New Year resolutions. At the beginning of a new

year, a high school principal decided to post his teachers' New Year resolutions on the bulletin board. As the teachers gathered around the bulletin board to read them, a great commotion started. One of the teachers was complaining. "Why wasn't my resolution posted?" She was throwing such a temper tantrum that the principal hurried to his office to see if he had overlooked her resolutions. Sure enough, he had misplaced it on his desk. As he read her resolution he was surprised because this teacher's resolution was "not to let little things upset her in the New Year."
