We human beings have a longing to become better, to become the best version of ourselves. Thus, all of our passions, all of our yearnings and goals which are active within our ourselves are the forces which encourage us to love beyond our strengths and also feed us upon with the hopes of the eternal reward. Faith, therefore, becomes a very important element in our journey through life. Our religion and spirituality gives us a sense of where our origins are, what our purpose in life is, what are the rules and the morality we are to follow, and what our destiny is.
