#### **Ascension Sunday**

We are so busy doing things, achieving,

and making progress that we can forget what life is all about: preparing to meet God in heaven. Jesus' ascension reminds us that we are "only passing through" on this earth, as we say; we are pilgrims on a journey. Just as Jesus' earthly life was temporary, and he ascended to sit at the right hand of the Father, so also our lives here are temporary, will come to an end, and we will meet God in the next life. Jesus' ascension reminds us in all of our busyness not to forget what life is all about. Jesus' ascension reminds us that God has great plans for us out of this world and that prayer in the second reading also reminds us that God has great plans for us that are out of this world.

You can look at yourself in three ways: what you think of yourself, what others think of you, and what God thinks of you. The most important is what God thinks of you. What a wonderful privilege we all enjoy as sons and daughters of God since baptism. How wonderful is this calling we have all received. How wonderful are the riches of heaven that God has planned for us. It certainly makes us see everything in this life in a new light. How wonderful is the power God worked in Jesus' resurrection to raise us all to new life.

Before Jesus ascended, he entrusted his mission to the apostles saying, "Go, therefore, make disciples of all nations..." (Matt 28:19; Gospel Year A) While that mission was entrusted to the apostles, and to the bishops their successors, and to priests their assistants, you can assist them in their mission to evangelize by praying for them and by giving witness that you follow Jesus. This is another way in which you live the prayer of the second reading seeing what hope God's call holds for you:

May God our Father...enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. (Eph 1:17-19)

The Christian vocation is about learning to live this new relationship in Christ together, with the Father, through the Holy Spirit and for the sake of a world that still awaits its full redemption. The Feast of the Ascension is not some kind of Intermission but a Continuation of the Redemption of Jesus Christ. HAPPY FEAST OF THE ASCENSION OF OUR LORD.
