MISSION APPEAL FOR THE CATHOLIC DIOCESE OF ZARIA , On July 8-9, 2023 at St. Joseph Parish, Toronto.

The mission appeal in your parish is to raise awareness of the plight of the vulnerable population in the diocese of Zaria who live on the margin of society

and cannot afford basic necessities of life such as food, medicine, water, and clothing. Through our diocesan office of Justice and Peace, we have identified such families at parish levels and helped alleviate their humanitarian concerns. However, the number of people in dire need has increased tremendously. The recent onslaught of the extremist Islamic sect, Boko Haram, has exacerbated the problem. Many families continue to flee conflict zones, leaving vast uncultivated lands that hitherto had served as the source of livelihood.

Most of those suffering from hunger and malnutrition are smallholders or landless people, mostly women and girls living in rural areas without access to productive resources. In children, hunger slows physical and mental development and leaves them vulnerable to many preventable diseases such as blindness, diarrhea, and respiratory infections, while adults become weakened, less creative and imaginative, and affect even their offspring, as in the case of women giving birth to unhealthy babies. Malnutrition is an underlying cause of 35% of the 1 million under -five deaths in Nigeria annually. Many people are hungry and incapable of meeting their daily dietary needs and food preferences, living an active and healthy lifestyle

We ask you to support us in cash and kind to assist us in expanding our humanitarian service to these vulnerable populations. Your generosity will alleviate the situation and enable such people to live fruitful and flourishing lives.
