Giving thanks with a grateful

God's Word calls us to be people of thanksgiving. To be truly thankful is to set aside our concerns—to set aside our fears and anxie-

ties, our mistrust and anger, our feelings of envy, jealousy or pride, and even our daily distractions. To be filled with the spirit of thanksgiving is to realize who God is and to acknowledge him as the giver of all good gifts.

May you experience the spirit of thanksgiving during this season & throughout the year! "I will give thanks to the Lord with my whole heart!"

The discipline of gratitude is the explicit effort to acknowledge that all I am and have is given to me as a gift of love, a gift to be celebrated with joy." - Henri Nouwen.

Have you ever noticed that gratitude often come in when we are deprived of things we are accustomed to having? Like when a storm knocks out electricity and we grumble" I want my power back on" Did we ever stop the 364 other days of the year we had power and say "I am grateful I have power? Or like now when we are on stay at home order and might be grumbling "I want to get out of this house. I feel cooped up. "We might be feeling ungrateful that we can't do the things we normally do in the ways we normally do them.

We have so much to be grateful for in this life, every single day. But reality is that sometimes constant life demands, battles, and worries gives more room to defeat than to a heart of thanks. Or we forget in the midst of busyness and pressures, just a pause and give thanks for all that God has done and continues to do in our lives. Sometimes it really is a sacrifice to offer praise and thanks. We may feel like it. We're struggling. We're weary. Or maybe, we feel like He let us down. We think God seems distant, like he's far away, or doesn't really care about what's troubling us. Painful life blows and losses might have recently sent us spiralling. It takes our attention off our problems and helps us instead to reflect on the goodness of His blessings.
