From the Pastors 'Desk "Waiting"

It's a longing for what is to come, but what is to come? It can feel disorienting and aimless; what is God's plan? It's an "in between" time that can feel empty or purposeless.

But God's plan is never random or empty or purposeless. He has a great purpose for your life, and for whatever reason, it includes a chapter of waiting and longing and anticipation. So, perhaps your time of waiting is a time of preparation. What areas of your life need to be refined? What virtue might you need to grow in before getting into something you've been dreaming about...? Or perhaps your time of waiting is for healing. Or perhaps your time of waiting is because God has a different plan for you than you have for yourself. Or perhaps you do not understand the purpose of your time of waiting. It may never make sense.

But remember, Jesus, God Himself, made even His very best earthly friends wait and feel some of what you are feeling. And we know that even in those moments, He never abandoned them and His story for them wasn't over. In fact, for most of them, it was just beginning! God's plan and story for you isn't over, even if it feels like you've been waiting a long time. Trust in His plan for you, that He will reveal it in His time, and that He has a great celebration for you coming.

One common struggle many people have is that of impatience. We tend to want what we want when we want it. In our fast-paced society we are used to instant everything. But the Lord does not work this way. He has His own timing which is always in accord with His perfect wisdom. Very often we can experience a temptation to do what we think is in the best interest of the truth and to do it now. But sometimes God chooses to wait before He acts. When He acts, His ways become clear and convincing and His wisdom is unmistakable

Reflect upon your desire to do great things for God or to speak the truth in one situation or another. Is your impulse from the Lord or is it your own impatience prompting you? This is an important question to reflect upon because God's Truth can only come forth at His command, in His time. If we try to push the Hand of God we will be doing so on our own. Yes, God will use even our misguided or impatient works for His glory, but our plans done in our way will never accomplish the glorious works of God as He can only accomplish them.
