SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT: MARCH 16, 2025

40 days of Nineveh to Lent



The entire book of Jonah is a story of God's unending faith in humanity. God did not destroy them for their sins but gave them a second chance by sending Jonah to them. Jonah thought he could run away from God but after spending three days in the belly of the fish, it dawned on him that God is everywhere. No one can run from God.

From the belly of the fish, Jonah begged for a second chance. We serve a merciful God who never gives up on His children; a God who would leave the ninety-nine in search of the one that went astray; a God who is ever ready to forgive.

When Jonah got to Nineveh, he did not preach to the Ninevites. He didn't say: "Change your evil ways. Stop sinning, etc." He simply went across the city announcing: "Only forty days from now and Nineveh would be destroyed..." Surprisingly, the people believed the word of Jonah; they did not attack him for telling them the truth. The effectiveness of a message does not depend on the preacher but the grace of God.

The forty days of Jonah's proclamation remind us of the forty days of Lent. As we hear the words of Jonah today, let us place ourselves in the position of the Ninevites. Let us return to God with fasting, ashes, and sackcloth. The King of Nineveh said: "This is a time to fast, a time to turn away from violence, a time to walk away from sinful pleasures and bad habits, a time to seek God's face like never before."

Imagine you have only forty days left to live on earth? How would you spend your last forty days? Wouldn't you rather seek reconciliation with God and others?

If that's what the pagan Ninevites did at the beginning of the 40-days proto-Lent that Jonah had announced, how much more seriously should we Christians take this 40-days season of penance and conversion? If they responded so thoroughly to the message of Jonah, how much more shall we respond to the "greater than Jonah," Jesus, who announced that same basic message to us? A week ago, as we marked ashes on our forehead and told us to "Repent and believe in the Gospel," was reminder that we are dust and unto dust we shall return. A fast that he called us to do it differently than all the rest. Inviting us to prayer, to almsgiving, to remedying our evil actions and replacing them with good actions.

Have a blessed Lent
