How Do You Want Others to Remember You?

What people will remember about us when we're gone. If you died today, how would people describe your life? There's no time to do anything differently—you've said and done all you can. Now all that's left is the impression you made on others.

Can you imagine what those impressions are? What are the five adjectives you would hear most, as people talked about you?

But you're not dead; you're still here. And now's as good a time as any to imagine what you hope others will say about you, what you hope they remember. And starting now, you can live in a way that makes those impressions and leaves those memories.

Dare to contemplate your own death—and then have the courage to live the way you want to be remembered.

As Christians, at the Eucharist, we hear the words of Jesus, 'Do this in remembrance of me'. This central act of faith is more than a retrospective glance back at the cross as an act in history or an emotional connection with that act. It is an opportunity for us to engage with the power and transforming impact of that act for the present.

As the theologian, John Swinton describes it: To remember Jesus is to bring him and the sacrifices and blessings that he represents into the present and to allow the memorial presence of Jesus to change, challenge, and strengthen us ... God's active memory finds embodiment in the community memory and resurrection. Whenever we remember as an act of faith, we do so much more than think about linear history: We are seeking to engage in a timeless activity. When we remember together and for one another, our memory is held between individuals and sustained by God. This brings us to the possibility of transformation, especially when we do so with the weak and vulnerable.

So how would we like to be remembered? Ultimately, we want to remember and be remembered as part of a faith community in the sustenance and action of God's memory.

May all of our memories of loved ones today and tomorrow take us to a wonderful place where we find each other again and where we also find and realize that the love of God takes care of each of us while we are absent one from the other. When our remembering takes us there, we find ourselves in a place and time we'll never forget. That may be the real purpose of our remembering, anything or anyone...
