Hope is Alive

Someone once told me hope is the last thing we hold on to when our circumstances tell us to move on or let go of what we are hoping for. For some of us hope can be easy to hold on to. For others, hope is the first thing that leaves us when issues or problems come into our lives.

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope." (Romans 15:13).

It means Jesus is alive and therefore hope is alive for you and I today! Hope never leaves us, we simply choose to ignore it or not acknowledge it. Hope is a feeling of expression. If you are going through a difficult and painful situation, I highly encourage you to express yourself to God. Let him know how you're feeling even though he already knows. God desires to hear your cry for hope and wants to draw close to you in your season of sorrow, anger or confusion. In doing so, whether you realize it or not, you are placing your hope in Jesus.

God wants us to place our hope in Him and not in a person, place or thing. God wants us to trust him and turn to him rather than losing hope and having nothing to do with him when things aren't going well for us. He wants to draw near to us in those hard seasons of life.

Hope is seeing light in spite of being surrounded by darkness. Sometimes in life, hope is all we have to hold on to. Believe it or not, hope is a necessary emotion that helps us engage with life. Hope is directly related to our sense of possibility. The greater our perception of possibilities, the greater our hope. Hope is what we feel when we think that life is worth living, when we are happy and thinking positive thoughts. Living a hopeful life is to recognize that everything and everyone matters, even you. Taking care of yourself matters.

Here's some things you need to focus on: Recognize that you can change your life at any time. Look for meaning in the most challenging moments. Conduct a hope audit of your life. How are you doing in health, work, family, relationships, etc.? Shift your expectations and take good care of your health. Have a stress reduction strategy, such as meditation, reading, or writing. Create hopeful relationships and learn to forgive. Help others see the best in themselves. Develop a daily journal writing habit to release negative experiences and emotions. Many of us need hope to look forward to the future. As you can see, it's important to embrace hope in all aspects of your life.
