EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS: SEPTEMBER 14, 2025



Our Lady of Sorrows

Our Lady of Sorrows is a profound title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary, reminding us of her deep suffering and unwavering faith during the most painful moments of her life, particularly those related to the Passion and death of her Son, Jesus Christ.

At the heart of this devotion are the Seven Sorrows of Mary—moments of immense emotional and spiritual anguish she endured. Each sorrow is a window into Mary's loving and courageous heart.

Reflecting on Our Lady of Sorrows helps us understand that suffering, while painful, can be redemptive when united with Christ. Mary didn't turn away from pain—she stood beneath the Cross. Her faith didn't waver, even when she couldn't understand why God allowed such suffering. In that, she becomes a model for us when we face our own trials. Mary's sorrow also reveals her closeness to humanity. She understands grief, fear, and loss—not in theory, but through lived experience. This makes her a compassionate intercessor for all who suffer: parents who've lost children, those betrayed or abandoned, and anyone struggling to find God in the midst of pain.

Here are the Seven Sorrows: 1. The Prophecy of Simeon: Simeon tells Mary that "a sword will pierce your own soul" when she presents Jesus in the temple. 2. The Flight into Egypt: Mary and Joseph flee with the infant Jesus to Egypt to escape King Herod's massacre of male infants. 3. The Loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple: Mary and Joseph lose 12-year-old Jesus for three days before finding Him in the temple. 4. Mary Meets Jesus on the Way to Calvary: Mary encounters her Son carrying His Cross to Golgotha. 5. The Crucifixion and Death of Jesus: Mary stands at the foot of the Cross and watches her Son die. 6. The Body of Jesus is Taken Down from the Cross: Mary receives the lifeless body of her Son in her arms. 7. The Burial of Jesus: Mary watches as Jesus is laid in the tomb.

In our world today, where suffering is often hidden, denied, or seen as meaningless, the image of Our Lady of Sorrows reminds us that God does not abandon us in our pain. Instead, He enters into it—with us and through those who love us. In turning to Mary, we are not simply seeking comfort—we are seeking strength, faith, and the grace to say with her: "Let it be done to me according to your word." Her sorrows, transformed by love and trust, become sources of hope for all of us.
