See Beyond to Help Others

"Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature... For the Lord sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart." — 1 Samuel 16:7

To "see beyond to help others" is a sacred calling one that invites us to move past superficial perceptions and into the deeper spiritual reality of each person's life. In a culture where appearances, performance, and image often dominate, the way of Christ challenges us to look with different eyes of compassion, discernment, and faith.

Jesus consistently demonstrated this kind of spiritual vision. He didn't just see people's outer circumstances — He saw their hearts, their hurts, their hidden hunger for truth and grace. He saw the leper as worthy of touch (Mark 1:40–45), the outcast woman as worthy of dignity (John 4:1–26), and the despised tax collector as worthy of transformation (Luke 19:1–10). Jesus didn't just meet physical needs — He met people at the soul level. To follow His example, we too must learn to see beyond — beyond appearances, beyond behavior, beyond even our own comfort or assumptions.

"Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ." — Galatians 6:2. When we see people spiritually, we begin to recognize the burdens they carry. A smile might hide grief. Silence might be a cry for help. Anger may be rooted in trauma. The Spirit invites us to look deeper, not to judge, but to love more effectively. Helping others from this place of spiritual insight becomes more than just a good deed — it becomes an act of true discipleship. However, this kind of vision is not something we achieve on our own. It requires prayer, humility, and the continual renewal of our minds. "Open my eyes, that I may behold wondrous things out of your law." — Psalm 119:18. Only when we allow God to transform our inner world can we begin to see the outer world through His eyes.

Seeing beyond also means serving beyond. It may require us to go the extra mile, to love when it's inconvenient, to forgive when it hurts, and to give when it costs. "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms." - 1 Peter 4:10. Ultimately, helping others is not about fixing them - it's about walking with them. When we see others as God sees them - beloved, broken, and redeemable - we begin to live out the gospel in action.

We warmly invite all children to become part of two very special ministries in our church community:




