THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: OCTOBER 26, 2025



Fire and Light of the Human Heart:

"Be angry, but do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger." – Ephesians 4:26 Anger and love—two powerful emotions that dwell within every human heart. Both reveal what we care about most deeply. Anger flares when something we love feels threatened or violated; love expands when our hearts are aligned with God's grace. The spiritual journey calls us not to deny anger, but to let love transform it.

Anger itself is not evil. Scripture shows that even God and Jesus experienced righteous anger. When Jesus drove the money changers from the temple, his anger defended what was sacred. It was an expression of divine love—a protest against injustice, hypocrisy, and exploitation. Righteous anger, guided by love, can be a holy fire that protects truth and dignity.

Yet human anger easily slips from holy passion into destructive force. When anger festers, it hardens the heart. We replay offenses, feed resentment, and lose peace. The letter of James warns, "Human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires" (James 1:20). Unchecked anger isolates us from others and from God. It blinds us to the goodness in those we oppose and poisons our spirit with bitterness.

Love, on the other hand, is the only power that can heal anger. Love does not deny pain or excuse wrongdoing; it purifies the emotion and redirects its energy toward reconciliation. Love asks, "How can I respond in a way that restores what has been broken?" When anger is purified by love, it becomes compassion, courage, and the desire for justice without hatred.

This transformation begins in prayer. When we bring our anger before God—honestly and humbly—we make room for the Spirit to act within us. Prayer doesn't erase emotion; it reorders it. God shows us not only our wounds but also the humanity of those who hurt us. Slowly, forgiveness becomes possible—not because the wrong was small, but because God's mercy is greater.

The Cross of Christ stands as the ultimate meeting place of anger and love. The world's violence and sin provoked divine justice, yet God's answer was mercy. Jesus, in his agony, prayed, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." At Calvary, righteous anger was consumed by redeeming love. That love did not ignore evil—it overcame it with grace.

In daily life, anger often arises in small, ordinary moments: a harsh word, an unfair judgment, a disappointment. Each moment is an invitation to choose either reaction or redemption. When we pause, breathe, and remember God's presence, love begins to soften our response. Instead of striking back, we seek understanding; instead of closing our hearts, we choose compassion.

To live spiritually mature lives is not to avoid anger but to let it be transformed by love. Justice without love becomes cruelty; love without justice becomes weakness. When anger is purified by love, it becomes a force for healing, courage, and truth. Then our hearts—once burning with resentment—shine instead with the steady light of God's transforming grace. 
