#### Leave It in the Hands of God

This simple yet powerful phrase captures the heart of one of the greatest acts of faith: surrender. In a world that constantly urges us to take control, to fix, plan, and manage every detail of our lives, the idea of letting go can feel uncomfortable, even impossible. Yet, faith

calls us to trust that there is a greater hand at work—one that knows the path better than we do.

Leaving something in the hands of God does not mean abandoning our responsibilities or refusing to act. It means doing our best and then releasing the outcome to Him. It is acknowledging that we are limited, but God is infinite; that our vision is narrow, but His understanding spans eternity. When we surrender our burdens to Him, we are not giving up—we are giving over. We are choosing to trust His wisdom above our own and His timing above our impatience. There are times in life when we pray fervently for something—healing, guidance, reconciliation—and despite our efforts, nothing seems to change. These are the moments that test our faith the most. It is easy to trust God when everything goes our way; it is much harder when His plans differ from ours. But true faith grows in the soil of surrender. When we leave things in God's hands, we make space for peace to replace anxiety, for hope to replace fear, and for His will to unfold in its perfect time.

God's hands are not careless or indifferent. They are the same hands that shaped the universe, that lifted Peter from the waves, that healed the sick and comforted the broken-hearted. When we place our struggles into those hands, we are placing them where they belong—in the care of the One who loves us most deeply and completely. Trusting God doesn't mean that the road will be easy; it means we no longer walk it alone.

Sometimes, the greatest act of faith is simply to be still. As Psalm 46:10 reminds us: "Be still, and know that I am God." In the stillness, we learn that control is an illusion and that peace comes not from knowing what will happen, but from knowing Who holds our future. When we surrender, we move from fear to faith, from striving to resting, from confusion to clarity.

To leave things in God's hands is to believe that even in uncertainty, He is working all things together for our good. It is to say, "Lord, I may not understand this now, but I trust You." And in that moment of trust, we find the courage to move forward with peace in our hearts. For everything we cannot control, for every unanswered question, for every heavy burden—may we find the grace to leave it all in the hands of God.




