

THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT: DECEMBER 14, 2025



GAUDETE SUNDAY

The Third Sunday of Advent is known as *Gaudete Sunday*—a day when the Church invites us to "rejoice," even while we continue our watchful waiting for Christ's coming. The rose candle on the Advent wreath stands as a gentle interruption to the season's

penitential tone, reminding us that joy is not something we wait for passively; it is something God plants in us even in the midst of uncertainty, longing, and incompleteness.

The readings for this Sunday repeatedly echo this theme of deep, Spirit-rooted joy. The prophet Isaiah speaks of a God who comes to heal the brokenhearted, free the captives, and bring glad tidings to the poor. This is not shallow optimism—it is joy born from God's promise to transform the world. It is a joy that knows suffering but refuses to be defined by it. In a world that often feels weighed down by division, fear, and exhaustion, Isaiah reminds us that God's future is already breaking into our present.

In the Gospel, we encounter John the Baptist, a figure of humility and clarity. John knows exactly who he is—and who he is not. He is not the Messiah but a witness to the light. His entire life points away from himself and toward Christ. There is a quiet joy in this humility: John is free from the pressure to save the world. His mission is simply to prepare the way.

As we stand at the midpoint of Advent, we might ask ourselves: Where is God inviting me to rejoice? Not because everything is perfect, but because God is near. Advent joy is not the denial of hardship; it is the conviction that God is at work within our hardship. It is the courage to believe that darkness will not have the final word.

Gaudete Sunday invites us to look for signs of God's presence in our ordinary days—moments of kindness, unexpected peace, a small act of reconciliation, or a renewed hope we cannot fully explain. It also calls us to be witnesses to the light, like John: to reflect God's compassion, to speak truth with humility, and to prepare space in our hearts and communities for Christ's coming.

As we move closer to Christmas, may we carry a joy that is steady, resilient, and rooted in God's promise—a joy that glows like the rose candle, softly yet unmistakably, in the midst of the world's waiting. Lord God of joy and promise, on this Gaudete Sunday you call us to rejoice, not because all our burdens are lifted, but because You are near and Your light breaks into our darkness. Strengthen those who struggle, comfort those who wait in grief or uncertainty, and kindle joy in those who feel forgotten or weary. Let the light of this Sunday's rose candleremind us that Your joy is stronger than our sorrowand Your promise more enduring than our fear. Come, Lord Jesus. Deepen our joy, renew our hope, and welcome You. our hearts ready to Amen. God Bless, Fr. Roshan Loy D'Souza, CSC
