A Journey Back to the Heart of God

Lent is not merely a season on the Church's calendar; it is a sacred journey of the heart. For forty days, we walk with Jesus into the desert—a place of silence, testing, and transformation. The desert in Scripture is not only a physical location but a spiritual reality. It is where distractions fall away and we encounter both our weakness and God's faithful presence.

The Gospel of the First Sunday of Lent always presents Jesus being tempted in the wilderness. Before He begins His public ministry, He fasts and prays. In that solitude, the tempter challenges His identity: "If you are the Son of God..." Lent invites us to confront similar temptations—doubts about who we are and whose we are. The world often measures us by success, appearance, or power. But in the desert, we rediscover that we are beloved children of the Father.

Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are not burdens imposed by the Church; they are remedies for the soul. Prayer reorients our hearts toward God. It teaches us to listen more than we speak and to trust more than we control. Fasting frees us from attachment—not only to food but to habits, comforts, and distractions that dull our spiritual hunger. Almsgiving stretches our hearts toward others, especially the poor and forgotten, making our love concrete and sacrificial.

Lent is also a season of repentance. Repentance is not about shame; it is about returning home. The Greek word metanoia means a change of mind and heart—a turning around. Like the prodigal son, we may realize that we have wandered far from the father's embrace. Yet Lent assures us that God is always waiting, eager to forgive, eager to restore. The Sacrament of Reconciliation becomes a powerful encounter with mercy, where grace renews what sin has wounded.

Importantly, Lent is not gloomy. It is hopeful. The ashes we receive on Ash Wednesday remind us of our mortality—"Remember you are dust"—but they also mark us with a sign of belonging. Our fragility is not the end of the story. Through Christ's Passion and Resurrection, even death is transformed into life.

As we move toward Holy Week, we are called to unite our small sacrifices with Christ's great sacrifice on the Cross. Every act of patience, every hidden prayer, every quiet act of charity becomes part of this offering. Lent shapes us into disciples who love more deeply and follow more faithfully.

May this Lenten season be a true pilgrimage of the heart—a time to simplify, to surrender, and to seek God above all. And when Easter dawns, may we rise with Christ, renewed in faith, strengthened in hope, and radiant in love.

This Vatican-approved exhibit has already been hosted on five continents, including some of the most famous Marian shrines such as Fatima, Lourdes and Guadalupe.


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
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
